Workshop Descriptions (B)=Basic (I)=Intermediate (A)=Advanced (S)=Specialty

Core Workshop 1 - Screening, Intake, Orientation and Assessment Trainer:

(B) This workshop will acquaint counselors with the competencies necessary to perform an accurate screening, intake, orientation and assessment. Among issues to be discussed are how to screen for toxicity, how to identify withdrawal, how to identify danger to others, how to determine a client's readiness for treatment and how to document assessment findings and treatment recommendations.

Cognitive-Behavioral and Reality Therapies: Theory and Practice

Trainer:

(I) This workshop will examine two theoretical approaches popular in addictions counseling: Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (CBT) and Reality Therapy. Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy is an action-oriented form of Psychosocial Therapy that assumes that maladaptive, or faulty, thinking patterns cause maladaptive behavior and "negative" emotions. Reality Therapy is a problem solving method that works well with people who are experiencing problems they want help solving, as well as

those who are having problems and appear resistant to assistance. Participants will be presented a brief didactic view of each theory and then engage in role plays using each technique with clients.

Family Systems

Trainers:

(B) This workshop will introduce participants to family systems, family counseling and the importance of working with the family unit. Some basic interventions, strategies and techniques of family counseling will be discussed.

Pharmacology Basics

Trainer:

(B) This workshop will cover the basics of pharmacology and is targeted for counselors in training (CITs), as well as individuals new to the field of drug abuse and addiction issues. The workshop will cover basic information on how drugs work in the body, and the fundamentals of the three broad categories of drugs resulting in abuse and addiction. These include those categorized as depressants (alcohol, barbiturates, benzodiazepines), stimulants (caffeine, ephedrine, amphetamines and cocaine), and confuse-ants (marijuana, ecstasy, LSD, etc). Great depth will not be the goal, but rather a broad overview of the general aspects of how these drugs alter thinking, feeling, and behavior.

Relapse Prevention

(B) This workshop will focus on the aspects of preventing relapse. Emphasis will be placed upon completing a comprehensive assessment of relapse for each client, relapse warning signs and developing a revised recovery plan to address relapses.

Co-Occurring Psychotic and Anxiety Disorders

Trainer:

(I)This workshop will focus on the co-occurring disorders of psychotic and anxiety disorders. We will explore the DSM IV TR/ DSM V diagnostic criteria of selected anxiety and psychotic disorders, risk factors for co-occurrence, and treatment approaches appropriate for these individuals. The workshop will be structured to highlight psychotic disorders in the morning and anxiety disorders in the afternoon.

Posttraumatic Stress Disorder

Trainer:

(A) Some people who experience traumatic events may eventually develop a disorder called Posttraumatic Stress Disorder or PTSD. It is common for individuals with PTSD to also develop problems with alcohol and drug use. Alcohol and drug use can interfere with standard treatments for PTSD. This workshop will review specific factors that increase risk for the development of PTSD following a traumatic event; examine factors that "protect" people from developing PTSD after a traumatic event; and some treatment considerations.
